

# Training for Industry



The STA provides independent and impartial training to meet the needs of its members on a variety of topics related to emission monitoring.

A requirement of the Operator Monitoring Assessment scheme (OMA) is for process operators to carry out periodic auditing of stack-emission monitoring activities. On-site auditing refers specifically to checking that the personnel carrying out monitoring do so in accordance with the agreed standards, site-specific protocol (SSP) and documented procedures. The aim of this one-day training course is to provide a basic understanding of stack-emission monitoring to enable process operators, regulators and environmental consultants to audit stack monitoring personnel and equipment.



## Course Content

MCERTS schemes for AMS (CEMS), personnel and organisations.

Pre-monitoring checks. Site review, risk assessment and site-specific protocol (SSP).

Selection of appropriate methods following international standards.

Equipment used in stack testing. Standard Reference Methods.

Auditing the stack emission monitoring team.

Post-monitoring checks including report format, calculations and estimation of measurement uncertainty.

Course duration. One-day online course starting at 09.30 via Microsoft Teams.

This course is aimed primarily at process operators, regulators and environmental consultants.
